

RESIDENTIAL AGED CARE SUBSIDIES

These rates are applicable from 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011.

BASIC SUBSIDY RATES

1. Daily ACFI subsidy rates

2. Maximum Daily ACFI subsidy rate

The subsidy paid for a resident will be the lesser of the sum of the amounts payable for the three care domains (ADL + BEH + CHC) and the maximum ACFI rate. The maximum ACFI rate is currently \$162.89.

The maximum ACFI rate will progressively increase as follows:

1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010	\$20 more than RCS1 rate (as indexed)
1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011	\$30 more than RCS1 rate (as indexed)
1 July 2011 onwards	Uncapped (ie full ACFI rate payable)

3. Maximum rate paid for a resident with an ACAT Low Approval

The maximum daily subsidy for a resident with an ACAT approval limited to Low Care, but whose ACFI classification would otherwise be High Care is \$45.79 per day.

4. Default rate for a new resident with an ACAT Low approval

For a new resident that has an ACAT approval limited to Low Care, the payments system will not make any care subsidy payments until an Application for Classification is received by Medicare Australia. Payments will be backdated as appropriate when the application is received.

5. Default rate for a new resident with an ACAT High (not limited) approval

For a new resident with an ACAT approval that is not limited to Low Care, the payments system will pay a care subsidy rate of \$45.79 per day until an Application for Classification is received by Medicare Australia. Payments will be backdated as appropriate when the application is received.

6. Late receipt of appraisal or reappraisal

Where an appraisal or reappraisal is received within 3 months after the end of the appraisal or reappraisal period, if the daily amount for a resident is at least \$25 the basic subsidy for the period up until the appraisal or reappraisal is received (the late claim period) is that amount less \$25. If the daily amount for a resident is less than \$25 the basic subsidy for the late claim period is \$0.

Where an appraisal or reappraisal is received more than 3 months after the end of the appraisal or reappraisal period, the basic subsidy is \$0 for the late claim period.
